PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the Apprenticeship & Training Office through the Department of Labor and Industry seeks to increase the number of apprenticeship opportunities in Pennsylvania, expand them into non-traditional occupations, and serve underrepresented populations by providing technical assistance and funding opportunities; and

WHEREAS, my Administration recognizes that apprenticeship programs are instrumental to improving job quality while addressing our Commonwealth's critical workforce needs, including rebuilding and modernizing our infrastructure, supporting resilient supply chains, advancing clean energy initiatives, enhancing cybersecurity readiness, and responding to evolving economy demands.
