- WHEREAS, Registered Apprenticeship programs are industry-driven, high-quality career pathways that enable employers to develop and train their future workforce, and individuals can obtain paid work experience with a mentor, receive progressive wage increases, classroom instruction, and a portable, nationally recognized credential; and
- WHEREAS, the State of Louisiana recognizes the urgent need to prepare and maintain a highly skilled workforce that is capable of meeting the current and future demands of the industry we serve and fortifying our economy; and
- WHEREAS, Registered Apprenticeship programs are uniquely able to meet the changing demands of Louisiana's economy.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jeff Landry, Governor of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim April 26-May 2, 2026 as

National Apprenticeship Week in Louisiana
