WHEREAS, an apprenticeship is a fast track to a good-paying, stable job, and an effective way to build a crucial talent pipeline that connects high schools to our workforce; and

WHEREAS, my Administration secured \$33 million dollars in the 2023-2024 budget to prepare more students for skilled careers, provide funding for apprenticeship programs, and expand partnerships between schools and employers; and

WHEREAS, as a result of my Administration prioritizing vo-tech in our classrooms and apprenticeships after high school, the Department of Labor & Industry has registered twenty-eight new apprenticeship programs, which have enrolled more than 4,600 new apprentices; and

WHEREAS, apprenticeship programs are instrumental to improving job quality, starting with youth and young adults, while addressing our Commonwealth's pressing workforce challenges, such as rebuilding our infrastructure, managing critical supply chain demands, bolstering our manufacturing production, and supporting our energy workforce; and

WHEREAS, a commitment to apprenticeship programs for our Commonwealth's youth is a commitment to keeping them in Pennsylvania with the opportunity for a prosperous career.

THEREFORE, I, Josh Shapiro, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby proclaim May 5-11, 2024, to be
