Project Purposes: The program goals of CareerWise New York and our partners are to strengthen and expand apprenticeship opportunities for NYC youth, increasing participation in our existing Registered Apprenticeship Programs (RAPs) and developing new RAPs in response to industry needs. Our goal is to significantly increase the enrollment of diverse, high economic need youth in CareerWise New York apprenticeships year-over-year during the grant performance period, supporting their current and future academic and career success.

Summary of Program Activities: With our partners, CareerWise New York will expand our youth apprenticeship program with support from this funding. Over the performance period of the grant, we will enroll 3,200 diverse, high economic need NYC public school students from more than 50 high schools into our youth apprenticeship, with 400 enrolling into registered apprenticeship. We will support youth apprentices in their success in this dual education program through in-school, out-of-school, and on the job support from teachers, program managers, coaches, and supervisors. By the end of the grant period, at least 75% of the youth enrolled in RAPs will complete their registered apprenticeship. Additionally, we will work with employer partners and the workforce system to identify and register new apprenticeships in high demand careers, and expand our current RAPs from 14 to 21, with an additional 7 RAPs added over the grant period.
