Key ASE Expansion Strategies

- Incentivize employers by allowing reimbursement for costs of related instruction
- Expand DLLR's capacity to conduct outreach, develop new RAP sponsors, and integrate all sponsors into the workforce system by leveraging additional staffing resources.
- Continue with quarterly roundtables where a different region of the state and industry sector is chosen as a focal point for discussion.
- Seed two large intermediaries/sponsors/businesses to help develop and scale a larger apprenticeship program .
- Collaborate with the Apprenticeship Maryland Program's participating employers to register their programs and dually register youth apprentices.
- Continue to develop the current prison-to-apprenticeship pilot program.
