Key ASE Expansion Strategies

- Develop a statewide Registered Apprenticeship (RA) support system.
 - Increase focus on integrated, rather than siloed, business outreach and assistance, ensuring identification and development of career pathways and industry-recognized credentials with each new RAP.
 - Enhance outreach efforts by opening new avenues of program development and finding new means of delivering local One-Stop system RA outreach plans and strategies, engaging additional employers, informing a new generation of youth and their parents of RA training opportunities, and connecting with local organizations to reach underrepresented populations such as low-income and minority populations.
 - Make use of Idaho's School to Registered Apprenticeship Program (STRAP). This unique program partners local school districts, businesses, the Idaho Department of Labor, and the Office of Apprenticeship, and offers high school students the opportunity to receive long-term career and occupational education and training both in the classroom and at a job site.
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
