Key ASE Expansion Strategies

- Continue to partner with local organizations, workforce investment boards, K–12 partners, and technical colleges to promote apprenticeship opportunities to underrepresented populations.
- Host regional information sessions about the benefits of youth and adult Registered Apprenticeship Programs for business leaders.
- Develop and deliver an effective participant outreach and recruitment plan, with assistance from the technical colleges and employers.
- Provide grant funds to partner colleges in the South Carolina Technical College System in the form of tuition scholarships for training and education programs on a reimbursement basis.
- Provide companies with a \$1,000 tax credit per registered apprentice for up to four years.
