Summary of program activities:	

- Develop new RAPs by partnering with industry sectors seeing significant growth or friction in retention (e.g. education, health care, early childhood, IT)
- Streamline services by partnering more closely with all 58 NC community colleges and with all 22 NC workforce development boards to connect candidates to apprenticeship opportunities, other federal services including WIOA, as well as engage more employers to become RAP sponsors.
- Further expand data sharing and develop a working group of state agencies, including NC Commerce LEAD, to evaluate data sharing, system change, and to develop a unified State system, with a commitment towards a unified National Apprenticeship system.
- Create four new positions to support the State’s apprenticeship efforts.
- Boost travel within the State and deliver a statewide conference for apprenticeship recognition and learning sessions.
- Coordinate employer incentives and education assistance dollars to educational institutions with active RAPs.
- Continue uploading data to the RAPIDS system and increase the number of Salesforce licenses for staff. (ANC utilizes Salesforce as its NCRAN apprenticeship database.)
- Partner to develop course curriculum aligned with a pre-K and K-12 teacher career pathway RAP.
- Identify, become culturally proficient, and have awareness to compassionately serve underrepresented populations.
