Key focus populations include women in non-traditional occupations, people with disabilities, people of color, and justice involved individuals. The primary outcomes of the grant proposal include:

- Register 800 new apprentices
- Register 60 new apprenticeship programs
- Engage with 75 new employers that implement apprenticeship programs
- Expand 20 existing registered apprenticeship programs
