Purpose:

- (a) To disseminate the definition of "Federal purposes"; and
- (b) To establish a Code number 650 for matters concerning 29 CFR Part 30, as Amended, April 8, 1971.

Background:

(a) Questions have arisen concerning the scope of the phrase "Federal purposes" in 29 CFR Part 30, as amended. Enclosed is a copy of SOL memorandum to Deputy Administrator George W. Sabo, dated June 24, which contains the official definition of "Federal purposes", together with examples of same.

(b) In the past, Code 501 has been used for matters concerning the Bureau's former EEO apprenticeship regulation in 29 CFR Part 30, effective January 17, 1964; and other equal opportunity matters. Important changes have been made in the amended regulation, effective April 8, 1971. To avoid possible confusion, the new Code number 650 has been established to cover all policy and informational data on the revised regulation

Action Required:

- (a) The SOL definition is to be applied in all appropriate cases.
- (b) Code 650 will be utilized in the future with respect to the amended regulation.

Definition of "Federal Purposes" Under 29 CFR §30.1



This responds to your request for a definition of "Federal purposes" under 29 CFR §30.1, which states: "This part also provides policies and procedures for continued or withdrawal of recognition of State agencies for registration of apprenticeship programs for Federal purposes."

Definition of "Federal purposes"

Under 29 CFR §30.1, "Federal purposes" includes any Federal contract, grant, agreement or arrangement dealing with apprenticeship; and any Federal financial or other assistance, benefit, privilege, contribution, allowance, exemption, preference or right pertaining to apprenticeship. Examples of such Federal purposes are (1) tolerances for apprentices under the Davis-Bacon Act, 29 CFR §5.5(a)(4); the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 CFR Part 521; the Service Contract Act, 29 CFR §4.6(n)(4); the Work Hours Standards Act, 29 CFR §5.14(c)(4); and the Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act, 41 CFR §50-201.1102; (2) Veterans Administration benefits, 38 CFR §21.4261; and (3) Selective Service deferments, 32 CFR §1622.
